Your organization must follow all Institutional Rules that apply to this event and are responsible for knowing all the <u>rules & regulation</u> [http://deanofstudents.utexas.edu/cci/stu_org_manual.pdf] prior to the event.

A few helpful reminders are:

- ✓ If you plan on having food, you need to get a permit. Forms and information are available here: [http://www.utexas.edu/safety/ehs/forms/index.html].
- ✓ If you are giving away non hazardous food, such as prepackaged candy, no permit is needed.
- Student organizations may not have a cosponsor to their booth with an off campus entity. Also please remember no corporate logos are allowed or any advertising such as coupons.
- ✓ There will be no slandering or disrespect of other universities.
- There will be no defacing of the campus through booths and their activities. Any activity that releases debris through participation (ie. Shaving cream, water balloons, etc.) must have a feasible means of trash control or will not be otherwise permitted.
