

### **BFA PORTFOLIO REVIEW**

The aim of the CGA@UIW program is to prepare students for a demanding and competitive profession. Dedication to this goal means that the program must be selective in quantity in order to offer the best quality opportunity that we can.

Because the Computer Graphic Arts program requires a specific set of skills, **all** students planning on entering the either the Web/Print or 3D Animation tracks in the Computer Graphic Arts Program must submit a portfolio for review in order to be admitted to the Computer Graphic Arts major and to their track area.

Portfolios will be reviewed at the end of the Foundations year. Transfer students who wish to start in the track classes must submit a portfolio at the scheduled portfolio review time the SPRING semester before they plan to attend.

# Each year, a limited number of students will be admitted to the track level. Only those passing the review will be allowed to register for track CART courses.

Since the number of applicants and their desired track will vary each year, passing grades in Foundations year classes will not guarantee admission to the track classes.

Students who do not pass the portfolio review may resubmit a portfolio the following year. It is strongly recommended that you retake some or all of your CART foundations classes to enhance your skills before resubmitting your portfolio.
